- Transportation

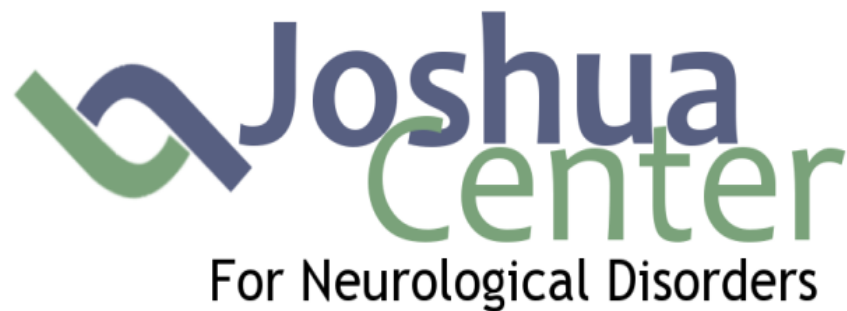
